#### 6.1 First Year

- 1. A pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the University.
- 2. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. programme.
- 3. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce steam shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. programme.
- 4. Provided that the candidates who have passed qualifying examination with artsstream/humanities shall be given preference in admission to

BA programme.

- 5. Provided that the candidates who have passed qualifying examination with arts stream/humanities/science shall be given preference in admission to B.Voc programme.

- 7. The student with compartment case is not eligible for admission.

### 7. Age Limit

Maximum age limit for admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com courses is 23 for male candidates who belong to the general category and 25 years for girls as on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ ST category. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of 6 months.

# **9.2** Admission under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Under RUSA:

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective or skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniformgrading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and

computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

### 9.3 Study Courses under Choice Based Credit System:

- 1 **Discipline Specific Course (DSC) or Core Course (CC):** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as aDSC or CC.
- 2 **Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 3 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
- 4 **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
- 5 Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses/Foundation Course: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AECC).
- 6 **AE Compulsory Course** (**AECC**): "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They are
  - (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication)

- mandatory for all disciplines.
- 7 **AE Elective Course (AEEC) or Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):** AEEC or SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills etc. These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

# 9.4 Students Course wise Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Evaluation

All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following components:

- a) **Term End Examination:** It is of three hour duration covering whole syllabus of the course and counts for 70% in theory for Arts and Commerce where practical are not involved. For Science and the subjects/courses where practical are involved it is 50% in theory, 20% in practical and 30% in CCA/IA.
- b) **Continuous Comprehensive assessment (CCA):** For determining CCA followingprocedure is applicable:
  - a) 5 marks for attendance.
  - b) 5 marks for class test to be taken on completion of 40% of syllabus by the class teacher.
  - c) 10 marks for house test to be taken on completion of 75% of syllabus.
- d) 10 marks for assignments, tutorials, general behavior of student. **Classroom Attendance** Each student will have to at tend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/ Practical's. A students having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the Term End Examination.
  - a) Provided that those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.

- b) Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital.
- c) Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribedco-curricular activities (e.g. NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
- d) Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co- curricular activities will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.

**Classroom Attendance Incentive:** Those having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to percent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows:

- > 75% but < 80% 1 marks
- > 80% but < 85% 2 marks
- > 85% but < 90% 3 marks
- > 90% but < 95% 4 marks
  - > 95% 5 marks

The registration for the Term End Examination will be done at the time of the enrollment for the course. The fee for the Term End Examination will also collected at that time as decided by the university from time to time.

- (iv) It shall be compulsory to score a minimum of 50% marks (aggregate) in mid-termexamination.
- (v) It shall also be mandatory to participate in activities of subject societies.

For determining CCA for the first, second and third years, the following procedure shall beapplicable:

- i) 5 marks for attendance.
- ii) 15 marks for class tests and Mid Term Tests.
- iii) 10 marks for assignments, tutorials and class performance.

#### 5) Mode of Selection

## All the students are required to adhere to the following Library rules strictly:

- i. All the students on the rolls of the College shall be eligible to become members of the College library.
- ii. Every student is entitled to borrow two books for a period of 15 days from the library.
- iii. The borrower shall be solely responsible for the safety/preservation

- of the books drawn by him/her.
- iv. A fine of Rs. 1/- per day per book will be charged beyond due date of, return of the book.
- v. In case a book is found mutilated, torn, defaced or misplaced, the actual cost of the book plus 20% of the original cost will be charged from the student.
- vi. Reference books are to be consulted in the library itself after obtaining permission from the Librarian.
- vii. The College also operates a book bank from which text books are loaned to poor students of all categories on payment of a nominal security, (i.e. actual cost plus 20% and maintenance charge of Rs. 2/per book).

Students can get their library security refunded within one year after leaving the College; otherwise the security stands forfeited.

### 16) IGNOU Study Center

The IGNOU Study center has been established in the college and it provide access to high quality education irrespective of age, occupation or qualification. It will benefit those who want to acquire professional and vocational education at their own pace and time without joining any college and institute. Prospectus for the admission to various programs is available with the study center. The regular students of the college can also join the IGNOU Course simultaneously.

### 22. Important Instructions

#### A. General Instructions:

- 1. It is mandatory for every student to maintain strict discipline within the College campus as well as outside the College.
- 2. Any act performed by the student that amounts to indiscipline will be dealt with strictly.
- 3. All the students are required to read the notices thoroughly which are displayed exclusively on the College Notice Board every day, and do the needful accordingly.
- 4. Teasing girl students in any manner whatsoever is an offence punishable under the law. Hence, students are advised not to indulge in such kind of activities; otherwise they would face strict legal action.
- 5. Scribbling/writing anything on the black-board, on furniture and walls etc. is a part of indiscipline.
- 6. Removing or causing damage to the furniture or window panes, plucking flowers, removing notices, etc. is also a breach of discipline.
- 7. The following acts also tantamount to indiscipline: holding any meeting/function/party and photography in the premises of the College without prior permission of the Principal.
- 8. Students should not tamper with the electrical fittings, water fittings etc. in the class-rooms, hostel and the College campus.
- 9. Using foul language with any student, teacher or any other employee of the College shall be viewedseriously.
- 10. The use of cell phone is strictly prohibited inside the classrooms and any breach of conduct will result the confiscation of the cell phone.
- **B.** Leave Rules

- 1. Application for any kind of leave on the prescribed proforma should be submitted well in time.
- 2. Leave up to three days will be sanctioned by the tutor. But in case of a leave for a single period the concerned teacher may be requested.
- 3. Leave above three days up to six days will be sanctioned by the senior tutor. Leave for more than 6 days will be sanctioned by the HOD on the recommendation of concerned subject teacher/senior tutor.
- 4. In case of a medical leave for a period of over 6 days, the applicant must produce a medical certificate.
- 5. The students can seek re-admission twice during the session. First re-admission will be allowed within three days after the name is struck off after paying a fine of `100/- and a fine of ` 200/- will be charged for the second re-admission within 10 days after the name is struck off from the rolls.

### C. Identity Card:

- 1. Identity card is the most important document of the college student, because it is the only identification for anyone to establish that one is a student of the college.
- 2. Any transaction between students and college is entertained only after production of Identity card. If astudent has to deal with any kind of work related to examination, library, collection/inspection of documents, and one has to produce one's Identity card in order to establish one's identity.
- 3. Students are not permitted to replace the photograph pasted on the Identity card for any reason whatsoever.
- 4. If Identity card is lost, one has to file an F.I.R. in order to get a duplicate Identity card issued.
- 5. In event of inspection of Identity card during surprise check or for

- any other reason, if the student is unable to produce the Identity card he/she will be handed over to the police or as the situation may demand. **Students without Identity card are deemed as outsiders.**
- 6. In case, the Identity card gets misplaced, misused by anti-social elements the student concerned shall be held responsible for his/her deeds. It is the personal responsibility of the student to keep his/her identity card in safe custody.
- 7. All the students are directed to collect their identity cards and complete the formalities related to their identity cards within one week of admission.

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#### RAGGING: A PUNISHABLE OFFENCE

PROIDBITION OF RAGGING UNDER H.P.EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS ACT

(PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT ,2009) defines 'Ragging' as doing any act, by disorderly conduct to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to the student. Such disorderly conduct includes, teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do an any act or perform something which such student, will not be willing to do in the ordinary course. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs.50,000 or both. If a student is convicted of the charges of committing, abetting, participating or propagating ragging, he shall be dismissed from the college and such student will not get admission in other colleges for a period of three years from the date of his dismissal form the college.
